



Conseil des écoles fransaskoises (CÉF) is the only educational organization offering elementary and secondary education in Saskatchewan that is authorized to provide instruction leading to a bilingual (French-English) high school diploma.

This diploma certifies that the student can speak and write in French at a first language level, as well as being able to do the same in English. In addition to higher level language skills, students acquire competencies that are recognized by universities and required for admission to a university program, such as one with special requirements in mathematics and science.

CÉF explicitly pursues a mandate working closely with the community, engaging children and adolescents, with a view to ensure academic success for each student, the development of a Francope identity, language skills and Francophone culture acquisition.

CÉF's virtual international education is aimed at grades 7 to 12 students and includes a preparatory year for the pursuit of university studies (after grade 12).

EARNING A DIPLOMA

Students who successfully complete their school journey at CÉF obtain a "Bilingual Francophone High School Diploma" which is recognized for the pursuit of higher level studies in both Canadian and international universities.

CÉF's diploma also certifies the bilingual competencies of those to whom it is granted (French and English).



CURRICULUM

The curriculum taught at CÉF schools is approved by Saskatchewan's Ministry of Education.

The seven compulsory areas of learning in the curriculum are:

- languages (French, English)
- mathematics
- sciences
- physical education
- health education
- arts education
- humanities and social sciences

Each one of the compulsory areas of learning includes specific knowledge, skills and values that are essential for every student, whether enrolled at elementary, intermediate or high school levels. Compulsory areas of study are therefore integrated into the school curriculum as a whole, from elementary to high school, until completion of diploma requirements.
